Top 100 Employer a third year running

For a third consecutive year, Cameco was named as one of the Top 100 Employers in Canada

for 2012.

The award, made by Mediacorp, looks at HR practices of more than 2,750 organizations and companies who were invited to submit a detailed application.

Selection was based on assessment of physical workplace, atmosphere, and workplace practices such as benefits, vacation and time off, communications, performance management and professional development. Charitable efforts and community involvement were also considered.

"For Cameco to be recognized three years in a row is a real tribute to our employees, who make Cameco a great place to work," said president and CEO Tim Gitzel. "As our company and our team continues to grow, we look for people who fit our culture and live up to our values."

Cameco is one of three mining companies and one of only five Saskatchewan-based companies on the list.

The number of resumes received went up by about one-third in 2010, and recruiters say many applicants mention our top employer status in iob interviews.

Aside from the national list, there are also 19 regional and special interest "top employer" competitions which are judged from the same applicant pool.

In early February, Mediacorp will notify winners of Financial Post's Top 10 and Saskatchewan's Top Employers awards.

Over the remainder of 2011 and in early 2012, the regional and special interest list winners will be announced highlighting employers that have the best initiatives or programs for diversity, recent immigrants, young people, older Canadians, environmental values and for being family-friendly.
